# How to apply to the Knauss Marine Policy Fellowship

## Before the application process begins:

- 1 Visit our website to learn more about the Knauss fellowship program and read about current fellows' experiences. [seagrant.noaa.gov/Knauss](https://seagrant.noaa.gov/Knauss) [seagrant.noaa.gov/knauss-blog](https://seagrant.noaa.gov/knauss-blog)
- 2 Start thinking about your application package. While you won't be able to apply until the application process opens, you can start drafting your personal statement and think about who you might ask for recommendation letters.
- 3 Register for the Sea Grant e-newsletter and/or follow Sea Grant on social media to receive updates about fellowship opportunities.

- 4 Prior to or during open "Federal Funding Opportunities" for fellowships, connect with your local Sea Grant program. Call or email them to let them know you are interested in applying. They will have advice for navigating the process. A list of Sea Grant programs and contact information can be found on the Sea Grant website.

## Once you see that the fellowship opportunity is open:

- 2 Contact your state Sea Grant program and inform them you want to apply for the Knauss Fellowship. They will have additional information for you and advice about navigating the process. Applications must be submitted through a state Sea Grant program. See the "Program Locations" dropdown on <http://seagrant.noaa.gov/> for a list of state programs and contact information.
