Issues and Concerns:

- Lake front flooding on low lying parcels.
- Entire neighborhoods and their road flooded.
- Marinas suffered flooding since most are immediately adjacent to the shore.
- Getting flooding from lake, in addition from wetland to the rear of the building.
- Want to build large berm systems, but only own a small parcel.
- Want to stop or slow wave action.
- Have damage to basements; possible utilities.
- Want to keep yard from flooding, while building is at a slightly higher elevation and dry.

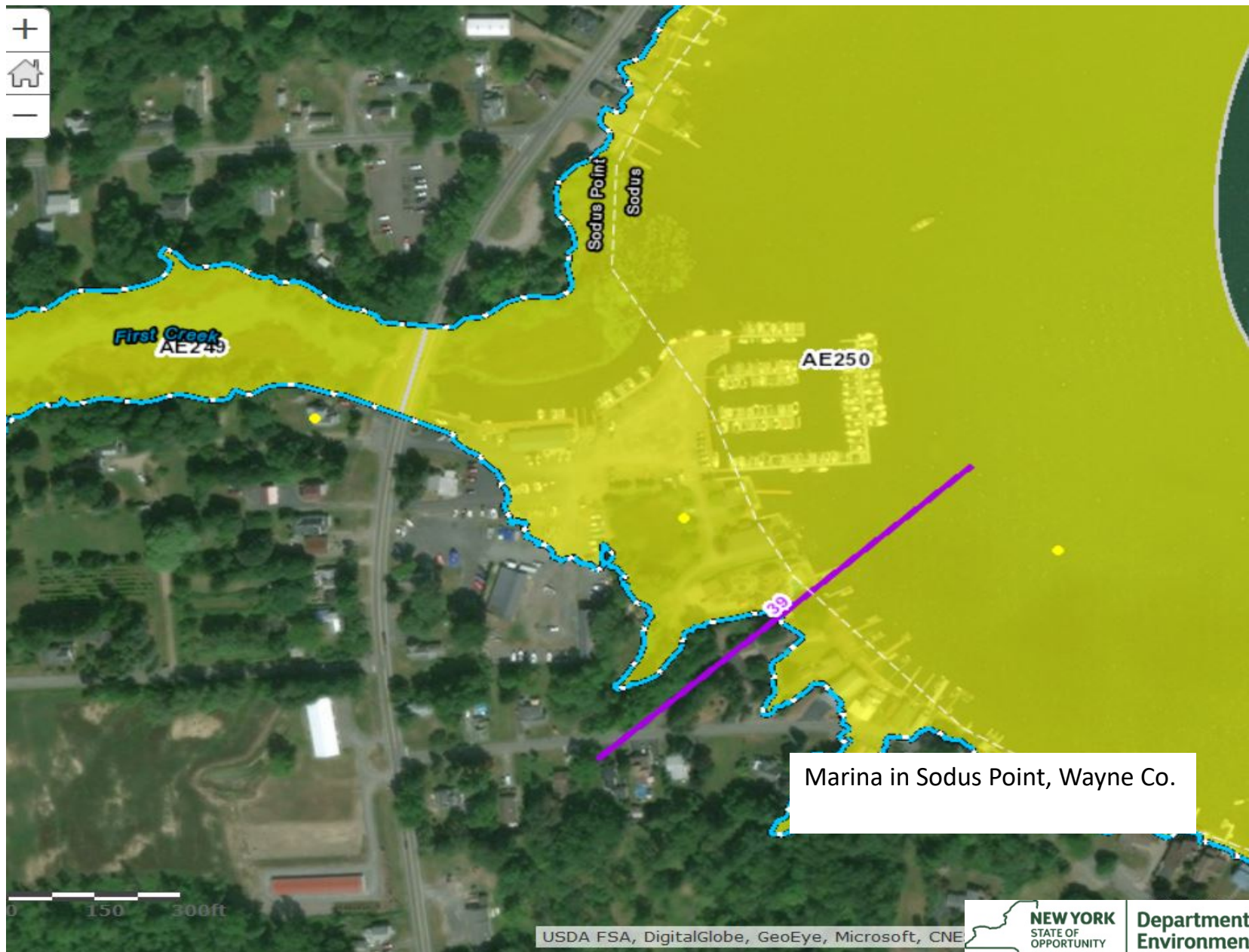

Summary

- Share your floodplain knowledge with residents; help them to make educated decisions about how to recover from the event. Install high lake level markers in permanent locations.
- Utilize FIRM maps, but make sure it is understood they do not account for wave run-up, climate change, events larger than 500-year events and development.
- Utilize the Coastal work maps, but understand they are not yet tied-in with the current effective maps.
- Help residents decide what resolution gets the most bang for the buck. Get them to think about which resolutions will be the most long lived.
- Explain that if the lawn is located in a floodplain, they should expect it to flood from time to time. Protecting the home and being resilient should be the priority.
- Do your substantial damage estimates! Leave a paper trail. Understand how a correctly completed Elevation Certificate should look. This may be one of the most important document you will ever use.
